HISTORIC PRESERVATION INCENTIVES



Federal Historic Preservation Tax Credit Program

SHPO approved **110 projects**, totaling more than **\$1.3 billion** in qualified rehabilitation expenses and more than **\$1.5 billion** in total investment.

Certified Local Government Grants

SHPO provided more than **\$1 million** in grants. As of 2023, **42** local units of government are in the CLG program.

Historic Preservation Special Project Grants

SHPO secured more than **\$1.4 million** in grant funds from the National Park Service for special projects statewide.



Michigan Lighthouse Assistance Program

SHPO provided more than **\$650,000** in grants to Michigan's lighthouses, resulting in a total investment of more than **\$1.1 million**.

SECTION 106/ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

Every day, SHPO works closely with state and federal agencies, local governments, Tribes, and consultants to efficiently move critical projects through the environmental review process.

Between 2018 and 2023, SHPO staff reviewed

more than **20,000**

state and federally funded, permitted, and licensed projects.

IDENTIFICATION AND DESIGNATION

Above-Ground Resource Survey

More than **240,000** acres were surveyed as part of community surveys and environmental review projects.

Archaeology Investigations

More than **48,000** acres were surveyed as part of academic research studies and environmental review projects.

PA 169 Local Historic Districts

SHPO reviewed **38** Local Historic District Study Committee reports. As of 2023, more than **75** communities have local historic district ordinances.

National Register of Historic Places

More than **100** properties were listed in the National Register, covering more than **190,000** acres and **1,600** resources.
