

The Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC) awarded a \$1.75 million dollar grant to the Three Rivers DDA/Main Street as part of the Public Gathering Spaces Initiative program! The project will include accessible restrooms, parking and a band shell for year-round performances!




2024 Pulse of Downtown



Described recent trends in 60% downtown Three Rivers as steady to improving


Said the frequency of their visits to downtown Three Rivers increased or stayed the same during the past year
